# NALOXONE HYDROCHLORIDE (Narcan)

# CLASSIFICATION

Narcotic Antagonist

## ACTION

- 1. Narcotic antagonist
- 2. May precipitate withdrawal symptoms in patients physically dependent on narcotics.

### INDICATIONS

- 1. Respiratory depression secondary to narcotics and related drugs:
  - a. Heroin
  - b. Meperidine (Demerol)
  - c. Codeine
  - d. Diphenoxylate (ingredient of Lomotil)
  - e. Hydromorphone (Dilaudid)
  - f. Levorphanol (Levo-Dromaron)
  - g. Morphine Sulfate
  - h. Pentazocine(Talwin)
  - i. Propoxyphene (Darvon)
- 2. Suspected acute opiate overdosage

#### CONTRAINDICATIONS

1. Known hypersensitivity

### USE WITH CAUTION

1. In patients known to be physically dependent on narcotics; be prepared to restrain violent patients if necessary after Narcan has been administered

### ADVERSE EFFECTS TO OBSERVE FOR AND REPORT TO THE PHYSICIAN

- 1. Withdrawal Symptoms
  - a. Sweating, gooseflesh, tremor
  - b. Nausea and vomiting
  - c. Dilation of pupils, tearing of eves
  - d. Agitation or belligérance
  - e. Convulsions
